Back home.



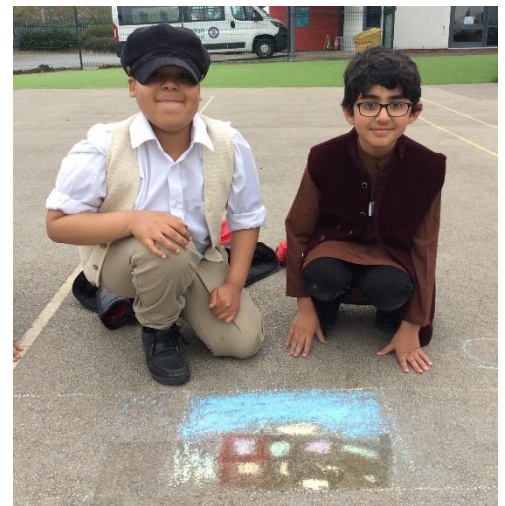
