

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#### A reminder:

Due to a delay in the easing of COVID restrictions, our 'Sports Day' will look slightly different this year. We still hope that parents/carers will be able to attend, although due to restrictions and government guidance, we ask that only one parent/carer/adult supports their child(ren) and that younger siblings attend only if absolutely necessary. To limit numbers and to follow government guidance, each year group will have their own dedicated Sports Day:

- ·Tuesday 13th July Year 3
- ·Wednesday 14th July Year 4
- ·Thursday 15th July Year 5
- ·Friday 16th July Year 6

As with many forced changes due to COVID, we have had to adapt and re-think how we approach things, often assessing what has worked well previously but also how things can be improved. Due to this, we have adapted our traditional timetable in favour of a Sports Day which encourages the children to take part in many more events both competitively and as a team member, being actively involved for most of the day. Field events (throwing and jumping) will take place throughout the morning and track events (running, skipping, dribbling, relays) will take place throughout the afternoon.

Parents/carers/adults are invited onto the school site from 1pm, entering via the main gates at the top of the playground. We ask that children arrive in their usual games kit, with a bottle of water, sun-cream and a hat (preferably that covers the neck).

We have taken the following steps to ensure the safety of the children and staff at CJS, as well as the wider community:

- Children will remain in their 'bubbles' and in zoned areas to stay consistent with our current safety measures.
- Equipment will be sanitised/wiped down before and after use.
- Parents/carers will remain in clearly marked zones within their child's class group, maintaining a 2m social distance where possible.
- Parents/carers are asked to stick to designated walkways and areas.
- Parents/carers are asked to wear facemasks unless they have a valid reason not to.
- Parents/carers are asked to use the toilets in the Hub (the old children's centre).
- Raised voices and shouting are discouraged as guidance suggests this may mean an additional risk of infection.
- Minimal chairs will be provided in parent/carer zones to minimise cleaning and avoid the chance of transmission.

Parents/carers are welcome to take their child home at the end of Sports Day from approximately 3pm but only when dismissed by a member of school staff. Please don't take your child until a staff member hands them over to you.

We thank you for your understanding and hope you appreciate the hard work behind the scenes to ensure children still have the opportunity to have some sense of normality with their Sports Day this year.

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### **Book Tournament**
