Last Day of Term

The last day of term is Friday 18th December. This will be a normal school day of learning but children are invited to





come into school in Christmas Jumpers if they wish (school uniform and a Christmas Jumper).

On Tuesday this week, the government chose to inform schools that they might like to take the Friday 18th December as a training day and to find another day in the school year to add this day back in for children. It was far too late an announcement, and we were not willing to give parents such late notice, so we are not changing the last day at CJS.

Tips for Parents over the Christmas Break (re: COVID)

Thank you for following all of the guidance regarding COVID 19. Cases in the school have very much slowed since half term and the sensible decisions made by parents have really helped this.

- Where a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms more than 48 hours since being in school, the school should not be contacted. Parents and carers should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.
- For the first 6 days after teaching ends (so that's up until Christmas Eve), if a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school, the Government have told schools that they should assist in identifying close contacts and advise parents and staff of the need to self-isolate accordinaly, as the individual may have been infectious whilst in school.
- Please only contact Mr Smythe (so that everyone else can have a complete break after a very tiring term) if you have any COVID related issues to share over the Christmas break. He can be contacted, preferably, on Class Dojo or by email if necessary a.smythe@cis.derby.sch.uk
- Where pupils are required to self-isolate due to contact with a positive case after the first 6 days following the end of term (after Christmas Eve), the government have said that schools do not need to be informed about their absence until the first day of the new term; however, it would be helpful and Mr Smythe is happy for you to contact him as soon as you know.



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

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





Parents' Survey


Thank you for the 160 responses we had to the parents' survey. Your feedback will help us to work with the governors to ensure that CJS is the best possible school for your child to learn.


We are analysing the results in great depth but the overview can be found in the following graphs:




Where figures don't total 100%, this will because some parents said they 'don't know'.









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
