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Car Parking and Child Safety

We have again received complaints about the inconsiderate and dangerous parking and driving of some of our parents. We appreciate that the vast majority of our parents who drive their children to school park safely and considerately, even if this means a slightly longer walk. Dinner Money

The cost is £2.15 per day, \pounds 10.75 per week and should, wherever possible, be paid for on ParentPay. ParentPay also has the facility for you to set up low balance alerts to let you know when funds are running low so that you can top up before getting into debt.

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Further responses to this week's Positive Covid test

Whilst we are confident that we have put into place stringent measures to keep everyone safe at school, and in order to avoid an 'outbreak' amongst staff and/or pupils, we have updated our risk assessment to ensure even tighter health and safety measures (amongst the adults) in school:

- Restricting, further, the number of staff members in shared spaces and offices at school:
- Staff on the school gates will now wear • face coverings;
- Reminders for all staff that they should • avoid being:
 - within 2m of others for 15 minutes or more
 - within 1m of others for a minute or more.

We will continue to encourage social distancing between pupils; the children are doing a fantastic job of that.

The aim is to ensure that we have a strategy for business continuity which means that we do not lose whole teams (e.g. the senior team, the office team) if one member of staff becomes ill and the others have to self-isolate. We have been delighted with the positive response from parents to our measures and we understand our duty to protect the community of Chellaston (and beyond).
