

<u>Tips for Parents over the Christmas Break (re:</u> <u>COVID</u>)

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Thank you for following all of the guidance regarding COVID 19. Cases in the school have very much slowed since half term and the sensible decisions made by parents have really helped this.

- Where a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms more than 48 hours since being in school, the school should not be contacted. Parents and carers should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.
- For the first 6 days after teaching ends (so that's up until Christmas Eve), if a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school, the Government have told schools that they should assist in identifying close contacts and advise parents and staff of the need to self-isolate accordingly, as the individual may have been infectious whilst in school.
- Please only contact Mr Smythe (so that everyone else can have a complete break after a very tiring term) if you have any COVID related issues to share over the Christmas break. He can be contacted, preferably, on Class Dojo or by email if necessary

 Where pupils are required to self-isolate due to contact with a positive case after the first 6 days following the end of term (after Christmas Eve), the government have said that schools do not need to be informed about their absence until the first day of the new term; however, it would be helpful and Mr Smythe is happy for you to contact him as soon as you know.
