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Spirit of Innovation

On Friday 14th May we had a whole school theme day focusing on the 'Spirit of Innovation', Rolls-Royce's first all-electric aircraft. Rolls-Royce is currently developing the aircraft and it is set to take to the air within weeks. It will also be aiming for a world record attempt by flying at speeds of over 300 MPH.

Our pupils were lucky enough to have a video call from Phil O'Dell, the pilot who will be flying the Spirit of Innovation during its world record attempt! They also spoke to engineers from Rolls-Royce about the project and their careers.

We then carried out a range of aviation activities throughout the day, including problem solving in maths to find the best link between weight, speed and cost and art activities to design a mission patch for Phill O'Dell.
