
Any credit on accounts will be carried forward to the new academic year. Any credit left on Year 6 pupils' accounts will be refunded over the summer holidays.

This week we had the final of our school book tournament. The following children all won in their Year groups:


Year 3 – James Baker: The Creakers by Tom Fletcher
